As part of the Queens Platinum Jubilee, Parish Councils throughout the United Kingdom were asked to plant a tree to commemorate Queen Elizabeth 2nd's 70th year on the throne.

The tree, a Mountain Ash or Rowan Tree was donated by Councillor Denise Hardy, the original tree having been donated by Hull City Council in 1993 as part of their scheme to give a tree to every child born at Hull Maternity Hospital.

Denise's daughter Eleanor received this Mountain Ash which has flourished in the garden and produced the sapling that has been donated. Hopefully it too will flourish and feed the birds with its lovely red berries.

The planting took place in the cemetery on 11th March 2022 at 11.00 am.

JIM WILLINGHAM Thorngumbald loses a true Gentleman

The loss of Jim Willingham earlier this year heralds the end of an era that started in the 1800's when George Willingham was the blacksmith at the forge on Main Road. Jim was born at the cottage next to the forge on 26th April 1932 to Howard and Lucy Willingham, Howard also carried on the trade of blacksmith and Lucy became the postmistress.

Whilst serving his apprenticeship Jim did his National service at REME, Combermere Barracks at Windsor. During his time at REME, Jim created a beautiful piece of metalwork for the Barrack gates,

which years later Jim's daughter Sue took Jim back to see his handiwork and get a photo with a squaddie. (See photo)

Jim met his wife Joyce whilst they were at Withernsea High School. Joyce was in service and her dad worked on various farms throughout Holderness. They were married on 20th June 1953 and set up home at Forge cottage. Howard still owned the property, but rented space for Jim to have a workshop and eventually a petrol pump. Note "rent", Howard was a true Yorkshireman. Their first daughter Susan came along in 1957, followed by Jane in 1960 Loz (Louise) a "happy accident" came along in 1967, to complete their family. Sue had a son Daniel, a daughter Charlotte and between them they gave Jim four great grandchildren, Sophie, Chloe, Jessica and Owen.

Jim diversified in recovery, being an agent for the AA, RAC and many others. The huge radio mast at the back of the garage enabled the recovery trucks to keep in touch with base. Jim also



developed the lorry chassis business, building the first hydraulic truck. In 1984 there was a fire at the garage which threatened to destroy the business, but like the Phoenix it rose from the ashes, better than before, and once again the business thrived, providing a service to the community. After the fire Jim's primary concern was for the elderly folks of Willingham Garth, who had their prescriptions delivered from the Doctors at Hedon, but he was undeterred and made sure there was a dedicated shelf for prescriptions in the temporary portakabin.

The garage shop was a focal point for many residents, especially for the school kids getting off the bus from South Holderness! Quite a few village people also benefited from employment at the garage, Margaret Thorpe and Jean Sayer were two of the ladies I remember working in the shop, many more worked in the garage and on the recovery vehicles. The recovery business also had a satellite branch in Haller Street in Hull to enable quicker recovery for vehicles west of the city.

Jim was always generous, not just with money, but with his time. He supported many sporting activities in the village. I'm sure many of you will have your own memories and stories to tell of Jim's generosity. When Jim finally retired, he kept busy building rabbit hutches, dog kennels and dove cotes, chiefly to keep him from getting under Joyce's feet!

Jim and Joyce were lifelong friends of Steve and Dorothy Robinson, the ladies spending Saturday afternoons in Marks and Spencer's, the following week they would go back to return the previous weeks purchases. Ironically, Jim and Steve became neighbours in later years.

In recent years, Jim took in "Rocky the rescue dog" and he became a constant companion. When Jim became unable to take Rocky for a walk, in stepped Doreen Auker who also lives in the village.

Doreen became an invaluable friend to Jim as his health deteriorated, taking him for hospital visits along with carrying on walks with Rocky. Jim called Doreen "his pal".

Jim's girls tell me that Doreen was a great help in Jim's last few weeks, sitting with him and comforting him when his dog Rocky died. Rocky's ashes are buried with Jim, which will no doubt cause ructions with Joyce....she hated dogs! As the heading states, Jim was a true gentleman and will be greatly missed

My thanks to Jim's daughters, Sue, Jane and Loz, for sharing some memories of their dad.

2 COUNCILLOR VACANCIES

The Returning Officer for East Riding of Yorkshire Council has confirmed that a request to fill 2 vacancies by way of an election have not been received within the prescribed time period, therefore these vacancies can be filled by co-options.

Are you passionate about your community? Do you want to help make a long-lasting change? Do you have innovative ideas for the council? Do you have concerns about a specific issue and want to do something about it? If this is you, then we need you. We need people from all backgrounds and experiences who reflect their community to put themselves forward for election. Make a change and become a councillor. The Role of a Parish Councillor is a voluntary role and is basically to serve your community as best you can and help the Council make decisions on behalf of the community working together as a body. Decisions can only be made at a Parish Council meeting by a majority vote and no individual councillor can make a decision on behalf of the Parish Council.

Meetings are held on the penultimate Wednesday of each month, (no meeting in August or December) at Thorngumbald Village Hall. If co-opted, you will be obliged to complete and sign a Declaration of Acceptance of Office and a Register of Interest. Thorngumbald Parish Council are also Trustees of Ryehill Village Institute, if co-opted as a Councillor you automatically become a Trustee. These meetings are usually held on the same night as a Parish Council meeting.

Anyone wishing to become a member of the council should show their interest in writing to the Clerk at the above address or via email **clerk@thorngumbald-pc.org.uk** giving details of why they would like to become a member, by no later than **Thursday 12 May 2022**.

THORNGUMBALD BARONS FOOTBALL CLUB - PLUMTREE ROAD PLAYING FIELD

Members of the Parish Council need to hear your views on the proposal below, the Parish Council agree in principal to this proposal but also value your input, please email clerk@thorngumbald-pc.org.uk with your views.

As a club we are looking to the future, to ensure that the village has a football club that can be sustainable and provide opportunities for all to be involved in sport. For us to do this the club is seeking support from the community to develop the facilities on Thorngumbald Playing fields. The club regularly draws more than 150 people, mainly families, to the playing fields to watch the children play matches however, the club has little to no facilities in place to accommodate such numbers. The club regularly encounters the results of antisocial behaviour such as broken glass and vandalism to our already decaying containers. The club passionately believe that if the field is more extensively used for purposeful activity and with increased security the community will see a reduction in the antisocial behaviour that often occurs on the field.

The club have been investigating funding opportunities and with support from HeySmile foundation we are confident that we can secure funding to move forward with our proposals. Through a formal leasehold agreement with the Parish Council the club can have access to a wide range of funding opportunities that currently are not available under the current arrangements. Our plan is to replace the decaying storage containers that we currently use with a brand-new clubhouse that includes changing facilities, community function space and an area to socialise. This will also provide opportunities for community use during the week and at weekends. Secondly, develop a fenced off "show pitch" for an adult team to play in the highest league possible providing football opportunities for children to progress. With improved changing facilities and a clubhouse, the club hopes to broaden participation by developing girls' teams and at least one team at every age group. Lastly, through the formation of a "Trust", the club will be able to seek funding opportunities to improve the playground area of the field providing improved play equipment that can be enjoyed by all the community.
