The Community Institute has some parking opposite near a children's play area and already hosts a number of activities including a Keep Fit class and Toddlers Group on Monday and Thursday mornings, Brownies on Monday evenings and Slimming World on Thursday evenings. It is also used by St Mary's and the Methodist Churches for various events throughout the year.

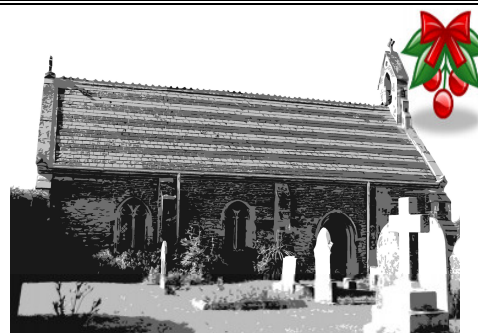


## Christmas at St Mary's Church
